


Our Challenge:

- The closure of school buildings dramatically impacted teaching and learning.
- School districts/school systems had very little time to prepare for remote learning environments.
- In some places, technology access (e.g. devices, Internet, etc.) impacted how remote learning could be facilitated.
- A remote learning environment impacted our approach to supporting students with disabilities and English Learners.



What might this mean for student learning?



- Predicted unfinished learning of 30% in ELA
- Predicted unfinished learning of 50% in math





What might this mean for student learning?


2019 Statewide NSCAS Data: ELA & mathematics


2019 Performance by Race and Ethnicity: % Proficient or Above in ELA


2019 Performance by Additional Student Groups: % Proficient or Above in ELA


2019 Performance by Race and Ethnicity: % Proficient or Above in Math


How does this impact instructional equity?

- High-quality instructional materials are a key lever for ensuring students are engaging with gradelevel content.

- Ensure **high quality**, **grade-level instructional materials** are at the core of our instruction for all students.
- Prepare our schools and our colleagues with simple guidance for the uncertain situation that lies ahead.
