What we Know:

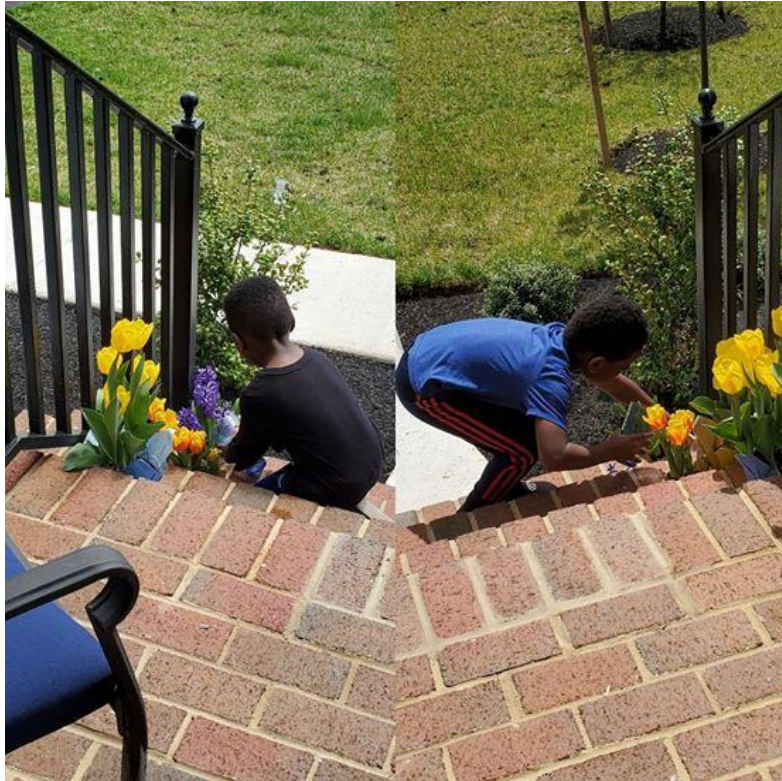
- Schools will be in session for the fall; what it looks like will be different across the state.

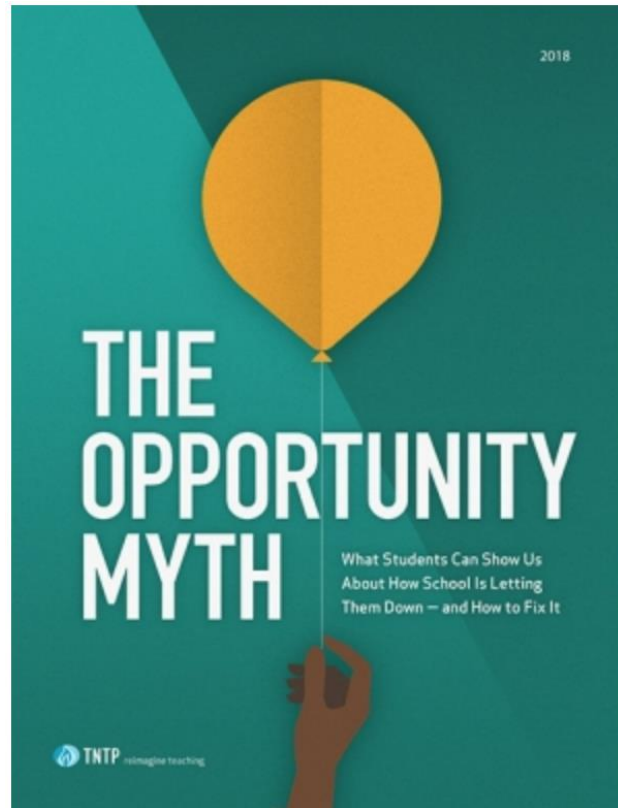

A Common Thread: Equity



- All students need and deserve **consistent access** to grade-level content.
- Students starting the year below grade level benefit the most from **on-grade level instruction**.
- **High-quality instructional materials** are a key lever for ensuring students are engaging with grade-level content.



Planning for Re-entry

How can we account for all of the critical components of re-entry and re-start while keeping instructional equity at the forefront of our minds?

We've got to get into the details.



Planning with Uncertainty

In Person

- Students and teachers return to school, put safety measures in place

Hybrid

- Alternating schedule for student attendance *in* school, “A Day / B Day”

All Remote

- Back to full remote learning.
- **We have to be ready for this!**



Two Truths

1. We need to **be prepared to go remote at any time** due to potential school building closures.
2. Some students and staff members will be remote because they have **at-risk family members** or because of **their own health risks**.



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Planning with Uncertainty

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- Students and teachers return to school, put safety measures in place

Hybrid

- A mix-elementary students in school, “A Day / B Day”

All Remote

- Back to full remote learning.
- **We have to be ready for this!**

Leadership and Planning: Big Take-Aways

- Regular “Town Halls” with staff and community
- Adjust schedule for first few weeks of school
- Technology outreach and tracking
- Flexible- incorporates new guidance
- Training for families on remote learning and social-emotional support

Conditions for Learning: Big Take-Aways

- Identify and plan for facility and cleaning needs
- Create new schoolwide systems and “traffic maps”
- Staff professional learning on health & safety
- Survey staff and students to determine needs
- Create activities and teaching plans for re-entry, train teachers on these
- Reach out to families and students in need

Continuity of Learning: Big Take-Aways

- Creating multiple and flexible schedules
- Ensure that the needs of students with disabilities and ELs are at the forefront
- Ordering important supplies
- Consider best staffing model based on outreach and needs
- Summer Planning and plan for teacher professional learning

**Summer Critical Actions:
Assessment Planning**

June

- Identify existing data that can help support teachers to make instructional plans (e.g. MOY NWEA from Winter, 2020), consider collecting additional data from teachers
- Review the data by grade level for high level trends
- Create an **Assessment Committee** that meets regularly (bi-weekly) over the coming three months. Include Curriculum & Instruction colleagues to discuss a plan for pre-assessments and connecting assessment planning with unfinished learning planning.
- Identify a half day to train teachers on pre-assessments during Pre-Service (even better if some of this work can happen over the summer!)
- Work with colleagues to identify a clear purpose for interim assessments and when/how these will be administered during the coming year

July

- Refine your understanding of your available data and how this data may impact instructional planning. Share your findings with relevant colleagues (e.g., school

- The NDE will continue to tailor supports based on need.

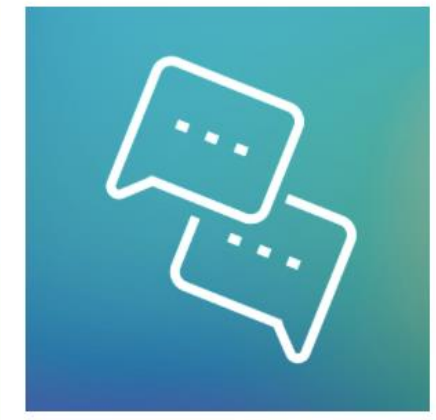
